Moore and Moran are the only Kansas congressional representatives supporting House Bill HR 82 TO REPEAL THE GPO/WEP. Legislation, (Social Security Government Pension Offset (GPO) and Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP). He also stated that Margaret Baptiste, NARFE National President, praised the Administration's commitment toward modernizing the federal retirement claims process system, but expressed concerns about other proposals in the President's FY 2008 budget, including a plan to expand Health Savings Accounts (HSAs) in the FEHBP program and a proposal to reduce the share the government pays toward the FEHBP premiums of certain FUTURE federal retirees.

Jim also spoke briefly on the upcoming State Convention, encouraging members to attend. He announced that the 2008 Convention will be in Hutchinson; the 2009 Convention will be in Manhattan; and the 2010 Convention will be in Hays.

Harold Williams, Herington, entertained the members with western trail songs. At the conclusion of his performance, President Jim Martin presented Harold with a Certificate of Appreciation.

Walt Germann, Service Officer had no report, but requested each member to bring someone with them next month and help increase membership.

Dixie Thomas, Convention Chairperson, reminded members to fill out their registration forms, and urged all to attend. Let Dixie know if you have any problems filling out the form. Volunteers who will be working only, and not attending meetings will not be required to pay the registration fee. Only those planning to attend meetings will pay.
